On September 22 at 12 PM, Dr. al-Hibri will speak in the Law School, Room 132, on “Islam, Liberty and the Rule of Law.”

Dr. al-Hibri, Professor at the T. C. Williams School of Law, University of Richmond, Virginia, is a prolific author as well as founding editor of *Hypatia: a Journal of Feminist Philosophy*, and founder and president of *KARAMAH: Muslim Women Lawyers for Human Rights*. In June 2011, President Barak Obama appointed al-Hibri to serve as a commissioner on the bi-partisan U. S. Commission on International Religious Freedom.
